Summary:
Bureau Veritas Certification has made the initial and 1st periodic verification of the "Implementation of the energy efficiency measures and reduction of greenhouse gas emissions into the atmosphere at State Enterprise "Selidovugol" project of «CEP Carbon Emissions Partners S.A.» located in Donetsk region, Ukraine, and applying JI specific approach, on the basis of UNFCCC criteria for the JI, as well as criteria given to provide for consistent project operations, monitoring and reporting. UNFCCC criteria refer to Article 6 of the Kyoto Protocol, the JI rules and modalities and the subsequent decisions by the JI Supervisory Committee, as well as the host country criteria.

The verification scope is defined as a periodic independent review and ex post determination by the Accredited Entity of the monitored reductions in GHG emissions during defined verification period, and consisted of the following three phases: i) desk review of the monitoring report against project design and the baseline and monitoring plan; ii) follow-up interviews with project stakeholders; iii) resolution of outstanding issues and the issuance of the final verification report and opinion. The overall verification, from Contract Review to Verification Report & Opinion, was conducted using Bureau Veritas Certification internal procedures.

The first output of the verification process is a list of Clarification, Corrective Actions Requests, Forward Actions Requests (CR, CAR and FAR), presented in Appendix A.

In summary, Bureau Veritas Certification confirms that the project is implemented as planned and described in approved project design documents. Installed equipment being essential for generating emission reduction runs reliably and is calibrated appropriately. The monitoring system is in place and the project is generating GHG emission reductions. The GHG emission reduction is calculated accurately and without material errors, omissions, or misstatements, and the ERUs issued totalize 3 669 297 tonnes of CO₂ equivalent for the monitoring period from 01/01/2008 to 31/12/2011.

Our opinion relates to the project's GHG emissions and resulting GHG emission reductions reported and related to the approved project baseline and monitoring, and its associated documents.

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1 INTRODUCTION

«CEP Carbon Emissions Partners S.A.» has commissioned Bureau Veritas Certification to verify the emissions reductions of its JI project “Implementation of the energy efficiency measures and reduction of greenhouse gas emissions into the atmosphere at State Enterprise “Selidovugol” (hereafter called “the project”) at Donetsk region, Ukraine.

This report summarizes the findings of the verification of the project, performed on the basis of UNFCCC criteria, as well as criteria given to provide for consistent project operations, monitoring and reporting.

1.1 Objective

Verification is the periodic independent review and ex post determination by the Accredited Independent Entity of the monitored reductions in GHG emissions during defined verification period.

The objective of verification can be divided in Initial Verification and Periodic Verification.

UNFCCC criteria refer to Article 6 of the Kyoto Protocol, the JI rules and modalities and the subsequent decisions by the JI Supervisory Committee, as well as the host country criteria.

1.2 Scope

The verification scope is defined as an independent and objective review of the project design document, the project’s baseline study, monitoring plan and monitoring report, and other relevant documents. The information in these documents is reviewed against Kyoto Protocol requirements, UNFCCC rules and associated interpretations.

The verification is not meant to provide any consulting towards the Client. However, stated requests for clarifications, corrective and/or forward actions may provide input for improvement of the project monitoring towards reductions in the GHG emissions.

2 METHODOLOGY

The overall verification, from Contract Review to Verification Report & Opinion, was conducted using Bureau Veritas Certification internal procedures.

In order to ensure transparency, a verification protocol was customized for the project, according to the version 01 of the Joint Implementation Determination and Verification Manual, issued by the Joint Implementation Supervisory Committee at its 19 meeting on 04/12/2009. The protocol shows, in a transparent manner, criteria (requirements), means of verification and the results from verifying the identified criteria. The verification protocol serves the following purposes:

- It organizes, details and clarifies the requirements a JI project is expected to meet;
- It ensures a transparent verification process where the verifier will document how a particular requirement has been verified and the result of the verification.

The completed verification protocol is enclosed in Appendix A to this report.

2.1 Review of Documents

The Monitoring Report (MR) submitted by «CEP Carbon Emissions Partners S.A.» and additional background documents related to the project design and baseline, i.e. country Law, Project Design Document (PDD), Approved CDM methodology, Determination Report of the project issued by Bureau Veritas Certification Holding SAS, No. UKRAINE-det/0604/2012 dated 30/08/2012 and/or Guidance on criteria for baseline setting and monitoring, Host party criteria, Kyoto Protocol, Clarifications on Verification Requirements to be Checked by an Accredited Independent Entity were reviewed.

The verification findings presented in this report relate to the Monitoring Report for the period of 01/01/2008 – 31/12/2011, version 1.0 dated 26/09/2012 and version 2.0 dated 05/10/2012 and project as described in the determined PDD.

2.2 Follow-up Interviews

On 08/10/2012 Bureau Veritas Certification performed on-site interviews with project stakeholders to confirm selected information and to resolve issues identified in the document review. Representatives of «CEP



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CARBON EMISSIONS PARTNERS S.A.» and State Enterprise “Selidovugol” were interviewed (see References). The main topics of the interviews are summarized in Table 1.

2.3 Resolution of Clarification, Corrective and Forward Action Requests

The objective of this phase of the verification is to raise the requests for corrective actions and clarification and any other outstanding issues that needed to be clarified for Bureau Veritas Certification positive conclusion on the GHG emission reduction calculation.

If the Verification Team, in assessing the monitoring report and supporting documents, identifies issues that need to be corrected, clarified or improved with regard to the monitoring requirements, it should raise these issues and inform the project participants of these issues in the form of:

- (a) Corrective action request (CAR), requesting the project participants to correct a mistake that is not in accordance with the monitoring plan;
- (b) Clarification request (CL), requesting the project participants to provide additional information for the Verification Team to assess compliance with the monitoring plan;
- (c) Forward action request (FAR), informing the project participants of an issue, relating to the monitoring that needs to be reviewed during the next verification period.



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The Verification Team will make an objective assessment as to whether the actions taken by the project participants, if any, satisfactorily resolve the issues raised, if any, and should conclude its findings of the verification.

To guarantee the transparency of the verification process, the concerns raised are documented in more detail in the verification protocol in Appendix A.

3 VERIFICATION CONCLUSIONS

In the following sections, the conclusions of the verification are stated.

The findings from the desk review of the original monitoring documents and the findings from interviews during the follow up visit are described in the Verification Protocol in Appendix A.

The Clarification, Corrective and Forward Action Requests are stated, where applicable, in the following sections and are further documented in the Verification Protocol in Appendix A. The verification of the Project resulted in 8 Corrective Action Requests and 1 Clarification Request.

The number between brackets at the end of each section corresponds to the DVM paragraph.

3.1 Remaining issues and FARs from previous verifications

No FARs were raised during determination.

3.2 Project approval by Parties involved (90-91)

Written project approval by the Ukraine #2893/23/7 dated 04/10/2012 has been issued by the State Environmental Investment Agency of Ukraine.

Written project approval by Switzerland Designated Focal Point was received for the proposed project on 21/09/2012 (Letter of Approval #J294-0485) .

The abovementioned written approvals are unconditional.

The identified areas of concern as to the Project approval by Parties involved, project participants responses and Bureau Veritas Certification's conclusions are described in Appendix A to this report (refer to CAR 01, CAR 02).

3.3 Project implementation (92-93)

The Joint Implementation (JI) Project is aimed at a reduction of greenhouse gases (GHG) emissions by modernization of technological



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equipment operated in the course of coal mining and through activities on extinction of a waste heap inclined to self-ignition and combustion. Project implementation will reduce fossil fuel and electricity on-site consumption and lower GHG emissions from waste heap combustion, which would cause GHG emission reductions against the current practice.

The baseline scenario provides for the continuation of operation of the existing equipment with routine repairs without any major investments, which meets the requirements of the state standards and legislation of Ukraine. Specific energy consumption for electricity supply and heat supply of technological processes remain stable or growing, causing higher GHG emissions into the atmosphere. The baseline scenario implies the continuation of the existing practice of waste heap monitoring.

Main project activities aimed at the reduction of GHG emissions into the atmosphere are:

1. complex modernization of coal mining equipment;
2. Extinction of SE "Selidovugol" waste heaps.
3. Implementation of permanent waste heap monitoring system and waste heap extinction technology at SE "Selidovugol" mines.

In June 2005, following the temperature survey, the waste heaps of Rosia, Kurakhivska, 1/3 Novohrodivska and Ukraina mines of SE "Selidovugol" was declared a burning one. A project to stabilize the heap started to be developed immediately. Extinction and stabilization of all waste heaps within the roject boundary were all completed by the end of 2005. Emission reductions started to be generated in January 2006. Thus, temperature surveys of the waste heaps of the aforementioned mines were conducted permanently; as a result, the waste heap was declared non-burning.

Energy-efficiency measures provided by the project at SE "Selidovugol" were implemented starting 2010. Therefore, to ease the calculation, baseline emissions from power consumption up to that moment are deemed equal to project emissions and are not considered in calculations up to 2010.

The identified areas of concern as to the project implementation, project participants responses and Bureau Veritas Certification's conclusions are described in Appendix A to this report (refer to CAR 03, CL 01).



3.4 Compliance of the monitoring plan with the monitoring methodology (94-98)

The monitoring occurred in accordance with the monitoring plan included in the PDD regarding which the determination has been deemed final and is so listed on the UNFCCC JI website.

For calculating the emission reductions, key factors influencing the baseline emissions and the activity level of the project and the emissions as well as risks associated with the project were taken into account, as appropriate.

Data sources used for calculating emission reductions are clearly identified, reliable and transparent.

Emission factors, including default emission factors, are selected by carefully balancing accuracy and reasonableness, and appropriately justified of the choice.

The calculation of emission reductions is based on conservative assumptions and the most plausible scenarios in a transparent manner.

The identified areas of concern as to the compliance of the monitoring plan with the monitoring methodology, project participants responses and Bureau Veritas Certification's conclusions are described in Appendix A to this report (refer to CAR 04).

The data and their sources, provided in monitoring report, are clearly identified, reliable and transparent.

The function of the monitoring equipment, including its calibration status, is in order.

The evidence and records used for the monitoring are maintained in a traceable manner.

The data collection and management system for the project is in accordance with the monitoring plan.

4 VERIFICATION OPINION

Bureau Veritas Certification has performed the initial and 1st periodic verification of the "Implementation of the energy efficiency measures and reduction of greenhouse gas emissions into the atmosphere at State Enterprise "Selidovugol" Project in Ukraine, which applies JI specific approach. The verification was performed on the basis of UNFCCC criteria and host country criteria and also on the criteria given to provide for consistent project operations, monitoring and reporting.

The verification consisted of the following three phases: i) desk review of the monitoring report against the project design and the baseline and monitoring plan; ii) follow-up interviews with project stakeholders; iii) resolution of outstanding issues and the issuance of the final verification report and opinion.

The management of «CEP CARBON EMISSIONS PARTNERS S.A.» is responsible for the preparation of the GHG emissions data and the reported GHG emissions reductions of the project on the basis set out within the project Monitoring Plan indicated in the final PDD version. The development and maintenance of records and reporting procedures in accordance with that plan, including the calculation and determination of GHG emission reductions from the project, is the responsibility of the management of the project.

Bureau Veritas Certification verified the Project Monitoring Report version 2.0 for the reporting period as indicated below. Bureau Veritas Certification confirms that the project is implemented as planned and described in approved project design documents. Installed equipment being essential for generating emission reduction runs reliably and is calibrated appropriately. The monitoring system is in place and the project is generating GHG emission reductions.

Bureau Veritas Certification can confirm that the GHG emission reduction is accurately calculated and is free of material errors, omissions, or misstatements. Our opinion relates to the project's GHG emissions and resulting GHG emissions reductions reported and related to the approved project baseline and monitoring, and its associated documents. Based on the information we have seen and evaluated, we confirm, with a reasonable level of assurance, the following statement:

Emission reductions achieved by the project for the period from 01/01/2008 to 31/12/2011 differ significantly from the amount predicted



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for the same period in the determined PDD. Emission reductions predicted in the determined PDD version 2.0 and actual emission reductions stated in the MR version 2.0 are provided in Table 2.0 of this report.

At the time of PDD development available data on the quantitative characteristics of the waste heaps of 2004 (OP "Mine"Rosiya",OP "Mine"1/3 Novogradovskaya",OP "Mine"Kurahovskaya", OP "Mine"Ukraine ") were taken to calculate the amount of GHG emission reductions. At the stage of monitoring the actual data on the characteristics of the waste heap of 2008 were used in calculations. This explains the difference between the amount of GHG emission reductions specified in the registered PDD (version 02) and actually reached values of GHG emission reductions provided in this monitoring report.

Conservative approach on volume of waste heaps used in the PDD is used in this monitoring report

Because in calculation of GHG emission reductions after 2008 data on the quantitative characteristics of the waste heaps of 2008 were used, although there was a shipment of rock after 2008, because waste heaps are active .
