Summary:

Bureau Veritas Certification has made the 1st periodic verification of the JI Track II Project "Pakruojo wind power park project", JI Registration Reference Number 0229, project of DOLOMITAS, AB, located near city Pakruojis, Lithuania applying the project specific methodology on the basis of UNFCCC criteria for the JI, as well as criteria given to provide for consistent project operations, monitoring and reporting. UNFCCC criteria refer to Article 6 of the Kyoto Protocol, the JI rules and modalities and the subsequent decisions by the JI Supervisory Committee, as well as the host country criteria.

The verification scope is defined as a periodic independent review and ex post determination by the Accredited Entity of the monitored reductions in GHG emissions during defined verification period, and consisted of the following three phases: i) desk review of the project design and the baseline and monitoring plan; ii) follow-up interviews with project stakeholders; iii) resolution of outstanding issues and the issuance of the final verification report and opinion. The overall verification, from Contract Review to Verification Report & Opinion, was conducted using Bureau Veritas Certification internal procedures.

The first output of the verification process is a list of Clarification, Corrective Action Requests, Forward Action Requests (CR, CAR and FAR), presented in Appendix A.

In summary, Bureau Veritas Certification confirms that the project is implemented as planned and described in the approved project design documents. The installed equipment being essential for generating emission reduction runs reliably and is calibrated appropriately. The monitoring system is in place and the project is ready to generate GHG emission reductions. The GHG emission reduction is calculated accurately and without material errors, omissions or misstatements, and is total 11862 tons of CO2eq for the monitoring period 01/10/2010-31/12/2011.

Our opinion relates to the project's GHG emissions and resulting GHG emission reductions reported and to the approved project baseline and monitoring, and its associated documents.

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VERIFICATION REPORT

1 INTRODUCTION

DOLOMITAS, AB has commissioned Bureau Veritas Certification to verify the emissions reductions of its JI project "Pakruojo wind power park project" (hereafter called "the project") located near city Pakruojis, Lithuania.

This report summarizes the findings of the verification of the project, performed on the basis of UNFCCC criteria, as well as criteria given to provide for consistent project operations, monitoring and reporting. The order includes the first periodic verification of the project for the period 01/10/2010-31/12/2011.

1.1 Objective

Verification is the periodic independent review and ex post determination by the Accredited Independent Entity of the monitored reductions in GHG emissions during defined verification period.

The objective of verification can be divided in Initial Verification and Periodic Verification.

UNFCCC criteria refer to Article 6 of the Kyoto Protocol, the JI rules and modalities and the subsequent decisions by the JI Supervisory Committee, as well as the host country criteria.

1.2 Scope

The verification scope is defined as an independent and objective review of the project design document, the project's baseline study and monitoring plan and other relevant documents. The information in these documents is reviewed against Kyoto Protocol requirements, UNFCCC rules and associated interpretations.

The verification is not meant to provide any consulting towards the Client. However, stated requests for clarifications, corrective and/or forward actions may provide input for improvement of the project monitoring towards reductions in the GHG emissions.

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1.3 Verification Team

Tomas Paulaitis holds a Master's degree in chemical engineering.

Kęstutis Navickas, Associate Professor, Dr. Bureau Veritas Certification Team member, technical specialist Kęstutis Navickas is Head of the Lithuanian Academy of Agriculture department of Agroenergetics. He has more 15 years of experience with the research and development in the renewable energy and bioenergy sectors (more than 10 projects).

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2 METHODOLOGY

The overall verification, from Contract Review to Verification Report & Opinion, was conducted using Bureau Veritas Certification internal procedures.

In order to ensure transparency, a verification protocol was customized for the project, according to the version 01 of the Joint Implementation Determination and Verification Manual, issued by the Joint Implementation Supervisory Committee at its 19 meeting on 04/12/2009. The protocol shows, in a transparent manner, criteria (requirements), means of verification and the results from verifying the identified criteria. The verification protocol serves the following purposes:

- It organizes, details and clarifies the requirements a JI project is expected to meet;
- It ensures a transparent verification process where the verifier will document how a particular requirement has been verified and the result of the verification.

The completed verification protocol is enclosed in Appendix A to this report.

2.1 Review of Documents

The Monitoring Report (MR) version 1 dated 15/01/2012 submitted by DOLOMITAS, AB and additional background documents related to the project design and baseline, i.e. country Law, Project Design Document (PDD), Guidance on criteria for baseline setting and monitoring, Host party criteria, Kyoto Protocol, Clarifications on Verification Requirements to be Checked by an Accredited Independent Entity were reviewed.

The verification findings presented in this report relate to the Monitoring Report version 1 dated 15/01/2012 and project as described in the determined PDD version 04 dated 14/09/2010.

2.2 Follow-up Interviews

On 15/03/2012 Bureau Veritas Certification performed on-site interviews with project stakeholders to confirm selected information and to resolve issues identified in the document review. Representative of DOLOMITAS, AB was interviewed (see References). The main topics of the interviews are summarized in Table 1.

2.3 Resolution of Clarification, Corrective and Forward Action Requests

The objective of this phase of the verification is to raise the requests for corrective actions and clarification and any other outstanding issues that needed to be clarified for Bureau Veritas Certification positive conclusion on the GHG emission reduction calculation.

If the Verification Team, in assessing the monitoring report and supporting documents, identifies issues that need to be corrected, clarified or improved with regard to the monitoring requirements, it should raise these issues and inform the project participants of these issues in the form of:

- (a) Corrective action request (CAR), requesting the project participants to correct a mistake that is not in accordance with the monitoring plan;
- (b) Clarification request (CL), requesting the project participants to provide additional information for the Verification Team to assess compliance with the monitoring plan;
- (c) Forward action request (FAR), informing the project participants of an issue, relating to the monitoring that needs to be reviewed during the next verification period.

The Verification Team will make an objective assessment as to whether the actions taken by the project participants, if any, satisfactorily resolve the issues raised, if any, and should conclude its findings of the verification.

To guarantee the transparency of the verification process, the concerns raised are documented in more detail in the verification protocol in Appendix A.



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3 VERIFICATION CONCLUSIONS

In the following sections, the conclusions of the verification are stated.

The findings from the desk review of the original monitoring documents and the findings from interviews during the follow up visit are described in the Verification Protocol in Appendix A.

The Clarification, Corrective and Forward Action Requests are stated, where applicable, in the following sections and are further documented in the Verification Protocol in Appendix A. The verification of the Project resulted in 0 Corrective Action Requests, 0 Clarification Requests, and 0 Forward Action Requests.

The number between brackets at the end of each section corresponds to the DVM paragraph.

3.1 Remaining issues and FARs from previous verifications
This is the first periodic verifications. There were no FAR's issued during the project determination.

3.2 Project approval by Parties involved (90-91)

Written project approval has been issued by the DFP (Ministry of Economic Affairs, Agriculture and Innovation of Netherlands) of that Party when submitting the first verification report to the secretariat for publication in accordance with paragraph 38 of the JI guidelines, at the latest (LoA is issued on 22/12/2010).

The abovementioned written approval is unconditional.

3.3 Project implementation (92-93)

The project involves a 6 MW wind farm consisting of 3 Enercon E82 2MW wind turbines and the necessary infrastructure for connection to the power distribution grid.

The official commissioning document recognizing that the wind power park was built according to the applicable national legislation was issued on 12/11/2010 by national authorities. The contract for electric power dispatch was signed on 06/10/2010 with grid operator VST, AB and the Project started to deliver electricity to the grid in September 2010.

Electric power meters were installed according to the requirements of the national legislation: the accuracy class for this type of measurement devices is 0,2 s (should be not less than 0,5 s).

Hence, it can be confirmed that the project has been implemented and the equipment has been installed as specified in the PDD and according to the national legislation.



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Project was fully operational during the 1st monitoring period. The project's net power generation was 3607 MWh in 2010, 15341 MWh in 2011 and was close to forecast stated in the PDD (4125 MWh and 16500 MWh respectively).

3.4 Compliance of the monitoring plan with the monitoring methodology (94-98)

The monitoring occurred in accordance with the monitoring plan included in the PDD version 04 regarding which the determination has been deemed final and is so listed on the UNFCCC JI website:

Data sources used for calculating emission reductions such as purchased and delivered electricity amount to the grid, are clearly identified, reliable and transparent.

Default emission factors value (0,626 t CO2/MWh) is selected by carefully balancing accuracy and reasonableness, and appropriately justified of the choice in the final PDD.

There is no requirement to review this emission factor during the crediting period.

The calculation of emission reductions is based in a transparent manner.

3.5 Revision of monitoring plan (99-100)

Not applicable.

3.6 Data management (101)

The data and their sources (monthly power dispatch reports on delivered/purchased electricity) are clearly identified, reliable and transparent. The received original monthly power dispatch reports are stored by the senior energy engineer and were provided for the verification. All monthly power dispatch reports were audited (100 % sample) and compared with the data presented in the Monitoring report and the data published officially on LITGRID, AB website: http://www.litgrid.eu/index.php?1973822023 and no mistakes or misstatements have been found.

The implementation of data collection procedures is in accordance with the monitoring plan.

The function of the monitoring equipment, including its calibration status, is in order.



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The calibration equipment is sealed and was functioned without any failures during the monitoring period. The calibration status of the measuring equipment was verified and found valid. The calibration status was valid during all the monitoring period. The calibration periodicity is 8 years according to the national legislation.

The evidence and records used for the monitoring are maintained in a traceable manner.

The data collection and management system for the project is in accordance with the monitoring plan.

3.7 Verification regarding programmes of activities Not applicable.





4 VERIFICATION OPINION

Bureau Veritas Certification has performed the 1st periodic verification of the JI Track II Project "Pakruojo wind power park project" in Lithuania, which applies project specific methodology. The verification was performed on the basis of UNFCCC criteria and host country criteria and also on the criteria given to provide for consistent project operations, monitoring and reporting.

The verification consisted of the following three phases: i) desk review of the project design and the baseline and monitoring plan; ii) follow-up interviews with project stakeholders; iii) resolution of outstanding issues and the issuance of the final verification report and opinion.

The management of DOLOMITAS, AB is responsible for the preparation of the GHG emissions data and the reported GHG emissions reductions of the project on the basis set out within the project Monitoring and Verification Plan indicated in the final PDD version 04. The development and maintenance of records and reporting procedures in accordance with that plan, including the calculation and determination of GHG emission reductions from the project, is the responsibility of the management of the project.

Bureau Veritas Certification verified the Project Monitoring Report version 1 dated 15/01/2012 for the reporting period as indicated below. Bureau Veritas Certification confirms that the project is implemented as planned and described in approved project design documents. Installed equipment being essential for generating emission reduction runs reliably and is calibrated appropriately. The monitoring system is in place and the project is generating GHG emission reductions.

Bureau Veritas Certification can confirm that the GHG emission reduction is accurately calculated and is free of material errors, omissions, or misstatements. Our opinion relates to the project's GHG emissions and resulting GHG emissions reductions reported and related to the approved project baseline and monitoring, and its associated documents. Based on the information we have seen and evaluated, we confirm, with a reasonable level of assurance, the following statement:

Baseline emissions: 11862 t CO₂ equivalents.
Project emissions: 0 t CO₂ equivalents.
Emission Reductions (Year 2010): 2258 t CO₂ equivalents.
Emission Reductions (Year 2011): 9604 t CO₂ equivalents.

Total Emission Reductions: 11862 t CO₂ equivalents.
