Status of JI Track 2 – Work under JISC

Background

- <u>JI Track 2 procedures</u> became operational in October 2006
- Launch of <u>accreditation process</u> in November 2006
- Web interface for administration and publication of JI projects and documentation fully operational since mid 2007
- Ensuring <u>transparency</u> (webcast, public calls, observers, documents on the web, Q&A sessions at CMPs/SBs, technical workshops, etc.)
- Ensuring <u>efficiency</u> (management plan, based on the experience of CDM EB, significant contributions from JISC members/alternates)

Main challenges ahead

- Continued consideration of determinations/verifications
- Further improvements of procedures and guidance documents
- Continued improvement of transparency, efficiency, consideration of experience gained



Mandates of JISC (1)

Supervision of JI Track 2 procedure

- Review determinations regarding PDDs
- Review "verifications" of emission reductions/enhancements of removals

Accreditation of independent entities

- Elaborate standards and procedures for accreditation of independent entities (appendix A to JI guidelines)
- Accredit independent entities
- Review standards and procedures for accreditation of independent entities and make recommendations to the CMP on revisions

Development of project design document form(s)

- Elaborate and amend JI PDD form(s)
- Develop guidelines for users of JI PDD form(s)



Mandates of JISC (2)

Guidance on baseline setting and monitoring

- Develop guidance on criteria for baseline setting and monitoring (appendix B to JI guidelines)
- Review and revise appendix B to the JI guidelines for consideration by the CMP

Governance

- Develop rules of procedure of the JISC
- Develop management plan of the JISC, including a budget plan, keep it under review and adjust it, as necessary
- Develop provisions for the charging of fees to cover administrative costs relating to the activities of the JISC
- Draw on expertise necessary to perform its functions

Recommendations and reporting to the CMP

- Make recommendations to the CMP (e.g. on revision of JI guidelines)
- Report on its activities to each session of the CMP



Status of JI Track 2 - Accreditation

Joint Implementation Accreditation Panel (JI-AP)

- Established at JISC 03
- JI-AP makes procedural and accreditation recommendations to JISC

JI accreditation process

- Launched on 15 November 2006 (applications from 6 October 2006)
- Accreditation procedure: desk-review, on-site assessment, witnessing
- Procedure was revised 4 times

Progress so far

- 15 applications for accreditation
- Desk review and on-site assessments completed for 14 applications
- 41 experts currently on the roster (from 5 public calls for experts)

Issues under consideration


- On-line training for assessment team experts
- JI accreditation standard (consolidation of accreditation requirements)

JI Track 2 total emission reductions (proposals), 2008-12, by country









Emission Reductions by Industry (Sectoral Scope)


203 PDDs covering 13 sectoral scopes (summarized below)

Key achievements in 2009:

- Determination and verification manual (DVM)
- JI programmes of activities (JI PoA)
- Revision of guidance for baseline setting and monitoring and related documents to clarify use of CDM methodologies under JI

Key challenges

- Increased interaction with all stakeholders, in particular designated focal points over the next biennium
- Expand outreach efforts to further inform and facilitate the implementation of JI
- Further facilitation of the accreditation process and considerations of further elaboration or clarification on guidance provided by the JISC to project participants



Closing remarks - Continued

Resources for JI activities

- JISC appreciates Party contributions over the biennium, totally 1.7 million USD, but notes that the JISC operates without the full funding requested
- The aim of being self-financing by 2010 through fees has not materialised, (presently at about 15% of the way towards the aim)
- Annex I Parties are urged to make early contributions for the next biennium to ensure continued JI operations
