What has happened

JISC has operationalised Track 2 and continued to issue guidance/clarification

- JISC has built up a process of interaction with stakeholders (as mentioned earlier)

Reflection on experience

- Have taken into CDM experience (in line with request from CMP), but not blindly following CDM
- JISC has made sure institutional set-up for track 2 in place (Oct 2006)
- Where stands the institutional set-up for other actors? AIEs, DFPs, market? JISC has heard concerns from time to time, but would say broadly in place now. Is this the case?
- Also we have become attentive to ensuring guidance is adequate for the AIEs to perform their roles - noting role not that same as DOE and the quality and consistency concerns that need to be taken into account
- Track 2 procedure working - JISC has considered 6 determinations & ready for verifications
- Accreditation process under JI functioning
 - recognise need of accredited IEs for final valid determinations
 - speed of process is fast given when started - compared to CDM reasonable progress
